Mr. Gilbert was directed to send out the dates and details of the meetings and events he had presented in his report.

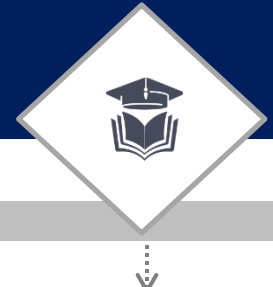
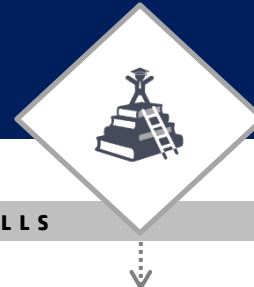
Chairman's Report:
